ITEM 7. CORRESPONDENCE AND RELATED INFORMATION

The first piece of correspondence came from Maven's Notebook regarding MWD board of directors agrees to fund two-tunnel California Water Fix. They have authorized \$10.8 billion for the project to build two tunnels under the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta. The second piece of information comes from the Orange County Register. The City of Irvine has hired John Russo as its new city manager, after being fired from Riverside in April.

ITEM 8. MANAGER'S REPORT

Operations Report:

The District is keeping up with the supply side of water in this weather.

Emergency and Fire Report:

The Incident Report for June 1 – June 30, 2018 there were a total of 260 calls, in comparison to the same period in 2017, there were a total of 228 calls. The year to date total is 1,618, compared to 1,573 in 2017.

ITEM 9. DM 2018-46. PUBLIC HEARING – Consideration to Approve Resolution No. 2018-843, a Resolution Authorizing Assessments Against Certain Rubidoux CSD Parcels Receiving Weed Abatement Services for FY 2017-2018: DM 2018-47.

BACKGROUND

For clarification, there was a typographical error that has been corrected. Parcel No. 178-260-043 should read **179-260-043**. This has been corrected and included in the Resolution to be adopted.

Attached for the Board of Directors' review and consideration is Resolution No. 2018-843, which if adopted this evening, will assess weed abatement charges upon appropriate parcels for property tax collections for those services provided on developed and undeveloped properties that constitutes a Public Safety and Fire Hazard. However, before adoption of Resolution No. 2018-843 is acted upon, the District Board of Directors must conduct a Public Hearing affording the general public, interested parties and/or affected parties the opportunity to comment and/or protest such charges.

Notice of this afternoon's Public Hearing along with parcel numbers of properties to be assessed were published in the public notice sections of the Press Enterprise and were made available through the District's web site.

As of the writing of this DM, Staff has not received any written or verbal protest with respect to any of the specific parcels proposed to be assessed and contained within Resolution No. 2018-843.

Director Murphy opened the Public Hearing. There were no comments from the public.

Director Murphy Closed the PUBLIC HEARING.

Director Muniz moved and Director Barajas seconded Adoption of Resolution No. 2018-843, a Resolution Approving Weed Abatement Charges on Certain Parcels to the Rubidoux Community Services District Board of Directors.

ITEM 10. Consideration to Approve and Authorize Retirement Payment for Cal PERS Annual Unfunded Liability. DM 2018-47.

BACKGROUND

The District has received the Annual Unfunded Liability contribution schedule as of June 30, 2017, from Cal PERS for the District's employer's contribution portion. This unfunded liability is Cal PERS trueing up District Annual contributions with investment returns against Actuarial Valuations and Projection for the District three (3) specific plans; Miscellaneous, Safety and PERRA. For planning and budgeting purposes, Staff has budgeted for this annual unfunded Cal PERS cost and is included within the Health and Retirement Expenses.

The District is presented with two options to pay Cal PERS unfunded liability for FY 2018-2019:

- **Option 1:** Pay over time the \$256,984.76.00 (Total amount of the three (3) plans) including interest @ 3.62% in twelve monthly payments of \$21,415.40 per month in addition to our normal Cal PERS monthly contributions.
- **Option 2:** Pay annually Lump Sum without interest. That amount would be \$248,003.00 (for all three (3) plans) and due on or before July 30, 2018. That is an interest savings of \$8,981.76.

Given our current average rate of return for investments portfolio is 0.98%, Staff believes it prudent to pay our unfunded actuarial liability as an annual payment thus saving 3.62%

in accrued interest for FY 2018-2019. Again, this Cal PERS expense was anticipated and budget as part of our 2018-2019 Budget.

Director Muniz moved and Director Barajas seconded Approve Option 2 to the Rubidoux Community Services District Board of Directors: Pay Cal PERS annual unfunded actuarial liability as a lump sum payment of \$248,003 for FY 2018-2019, thus saving \$8,981.76 in interest.

ITEM 11. Consideration to Adopt Water Supply Assessment for Proposed Rio Vista Specific Plan. DM 2018-48.

When the Rubidoux Community Services District receives a request for water availability for a proposed project, those requests are handled as an administrative matter by Staff with the issuance of a “**Will Serve Letter.**” However, with the passage of SB 610 and SB 221, any proposed residential development with 500 or more dwelling units, or commercial development employing more than 1,000 persons or having more than 650,000 sq. ft. of floor space, or missed-use development having a water demand equivalent to 500 dwelling units, must prepare a “**Water Supply Assessment**” (WSA) for each proposed development meeting the above thresholds.

District Staff received an Inter-Agency Project Review Request from the City of Jurupa Valley for a project within the District meeting the above-mentioned thresholds. The “Rio Vista Specific Plan” is a proposed 917-acre development located in the northeast quadrant of the City of Jurupa Valley, specifically west of Rubidoux Boulevard, south of the Riverside/San Bernardino county line, east of Armstrong Road and Sierra Avenue, and north of La Canada Drive. The project site plan is attached as Exhibit “A”. Specifically, the project will consist of a maximum of 1,674 residential dwelling units, a 13.3-acre school site, 18.6 acres of parks, and 608.6 acres of open space. The draft WSA identifies a water demand of 2,000 AF per year by the project. Further, the draft WSA report determines the District has significant unused pumping rights within the Colton/Riverside Groundwater Basins and consequently can assure a 20-year supply pursuant to SB 610 and SB 221.

The area designated as the Rio Vista Specific Plan was identified in the District’s Water Facilities Master Plan with an anticipated annual water demand of 2,000 AF/yr. The demand is also included in the District’s recently adopted 2015 Urban Water management Plan.

“The conclusion of the WSA is that the District is guaranteed a sufficient water supply from the Riverside Groundwater Basin to meet current and future water demands”... including the proposed project.

The attached excerpts of the draft Water Supply Assessment was prepared in compliance with SB 610 and SB 221. It determines that the Rubidoux community Services District has adequate local groundwater supplies to accommodate the proposed Rio Vista Specific Plan development.

Mr. Steve Appel, District Engineer, answered questions on the proposed Rio Vista Specific Plan.

Director Barajas moved and Director Trowbridge seconded adoption of the WSA report as presented.

ITEM 12. DM 2018-49. Receive and File Statement of Cash Asset Schedule Report Ending June 2018.

BACKGROUND

The year-to-date Interest ending June 30, 2018 is \$201,932.00 for District controlled accounts. With respect to District “Funds in Trust”, we show \$8,701.00 which has been earned and posted. The District has a combined YTD total of \$210,639.53 as of June 30, 2018.

With respect to the District’s Operating Funds (Excluding Operating Reserves), we show a balance of \$5,958,827.00 ending June 30, 2018. That is **\$987,754.00 MORE** than July 1, 2017, beginning balance of \$4,971.073.00.

The District’s Field/admin Fund continues to grow and current fund balance nears \$380,000.00.

Submitted for the board of directors consideration is the *June 2018, Statement of Cash Asset Schedule Report* for your review and acceptance this evening.

ITEM 13. Consideration to Approve Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between Rubidoux CSD and Labors International Union, Local 777, Effective July 1, 2018, thru June 30, 2021. DM 2018-50.

BACKGROUND

Early this year the Rubidoux Community Services District received a letter from Mr. Paul Bechely, requesting to engage negotiations on behalf of RCSD Employees. Mr. Bechely's letter dated April 12, 2018, provided proposals to commence negotiations with the District. As has been the practice, District Staff and the Personnel Committee members (Directors Muniz and Trueba) scheduled several meetings to negotiate in good faith on behalf of the Rubidoux Community Services District.

The Personnel Committee held two meetings, April 23, and May 10, 2018, and concluded the negotiations conditioned upon Mr. Bechely presenting the Rubidoux CSD employees the tentative MOU settlement and agreement proposal. It was approved on June 7, 2018, by the voting members.

The changes to the attached MOU can be categorized in two sections; Compliance and Negotiated.

➤ **A) COMPLIANCE:**

State of CA Pension Reform (PEPRA) and Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) requirements have been incorporated into the MOU for this upcoming term. The Pension Reform requires employee to assume 8% historically funded by cities, counties, and Special Districts. The implementation date for the above was January 1, 2018.

Since the Rubidoux CSD/labor Union did not address this in the past MOU the Union proposed two Pension Offset alternatives in the first year of this term. Those options were as follows: 6% (employee)/ 2% (employer) in first year or, as an alternative, 8% (employee) / 0% (employer) in the first year which would satisfy the State's Pension Reform Act. Union and District agreed to the full compliance second option...8% / 0%. The Pension obligation is revenue neutral to both Employer and Employee since the District has budgeted to pay and will now be transferred to the employee in the form of compensation.

With respect to FLSA those revisions are summarized on the attached ***MOU and Policy Changes Memo***. Again, revisions to reflect FLSA and current District employment practices.

➤ **B) NEGOTIATED:**

The term is for three years, the CPI adjustment shall remain at 2% this year. Second year, the CPI range will be 2% to 3%. And Third year as well with reopener should the CPI exceed 3.75%.

The expired 2018 MOU committed the District to conduct a salary survey by a third party. The results and agreed to changes will adjust only two classes, the Pretreatment/Backflow Inspector and Re-class and Reorganization of the Account Clerks I, II, and III's. Those adjustments are reflective on the attached 2018-2019 Salary Plan.

Finally, the District and Union agree to change Health Care Providers and contract (re contract) with CAL PERS for health benefits. The net effect is more choices of health care providers and a savings of about \$2,000.00 a month should all employees continue with same or similar health care provider and coverage.

Director Barajas moved and Director Muniz seconded the Rubidoux Community Services District Approve the MOU as negotiated and presented commencing July 1, 2018 thru June 30, 2021.

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

Crystal Geysler, Two Other Companies Charged with Transporting Arsenic in Wastewater

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CG Roxane, LLC (Crystal Geysler), United Pumping Services, Inc. and United Storm Water, Inc. are now each facing a statutory maximum fine of \$8 million on a 16-count indictment recently returned by a United States Attorney's Office, Central District of California, grand jury. The three companies are charged with the alleged failure to disclose information regarding arsenic in wastewater transported from Crystal Geysler's Olancho, California, facility in March and May 2015. The alleged hazardous wastewater transport violated both the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) and the Hazardous Materials Transportation Act (HMTA).



Crystal Geysler, a limited liability corporation, produces bottled drinking water in Olancho, CA in the Owens Valley. According to the grand jury's indictment, Crystal Geysler draws water from local, natural sources that contained naturally occurring arsenic. To reduce the concentration of arsenic Crystal Geysler would use sand filters to so that the water met federal drinking water standards. The investigation and the recently filed indictment are focused on the alleged violations involving Crystal Geysler's wastewater but not the safety or quality of Crystal Geysler's bottled water.

To maintain the effectiveness of the sand filters, Crystal Geysler utilized a process that generated thousands of gallons of arsenic-contaminated wastewater. The company regenerated the sand filters by back-flushing a hydroxide and water solution through the sand filters, causing the filters to release arsenic into the hydroxide and water solution.

Allegedly Crystal Geysler then discharged the arsenic-contaminated wastewater into a nearby manmade pond which Crystal Geysler called "the Arsenic Pond." Testing by the California Department of Toxic Substances Control (DTSC) in September 2014 revealed the wastewater in Arsenic Pond constituted a hazardous waste. Subsequent DTSC testing in October 2014 found hazardous waste conditions in the wastewater generated by Crystal Geysler's regeneration process.

Although Crystal Geysler ceased discharging regeneration wastewater into Arsenic Pond after DTSC's October testing, in March 2015 Crystal Geysler regenerated and back-flushed the sand filters and, it subsequently hired United Pumping and United Storm Water, both based in the City of Industry, to transport the resulting wastewater — several thousand gallons of high pH, arsenic-contaminated wastewater — to a hazardous waste facility in Los Angeles County.



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The indictment further alleges that in April 2015, DTSC informed Crystal Geyser that the wastewater in the Arsenic Pond constituted a hazardous waste. They instructed Crystal Geyser to remove the wastewater from the Arsenic Pond and to transport it, using a hazardous waste manifest, to an authorized facility permitted to accept that specific type of hazardous waste.

In hiring United Pumping and United Storm Water, Crystal Geyser again violated RCRA and HMTA. The two subcontractors drained Arsenic Pond and transported the contents of the Arsenic Pond to a facility in Fontana, California despite the fact that that facility was not permitted to treat hazardous waste.

"Our nation's environmental laws are specifically designed to ensure that hazardous wastes are properly handled from beginning to end – from the point of generation to the point of disposal," said United States Attorney Nick Hanna. "The alleged behavior of the three companies charged in this indictment undermines that important objective and jeopardizes the safety of our community."

The indictment further indicates that Crystal Geyser, United Pumping, and United Storm Water transported the contents of the Arsenic Pond using non-hazardous waste manifests. They did not identify the arsenic in the wastewater, even though they knew that the water constituted arsenic hazardous waste.

"EPA and its law enforcement partners are committed to the protection of public health and safety," said Special Agent-in-Charge Jay M. Green of EPA's criminal enforcement program in CA. "This case was opened due to the hazards posed by illegal management and transportation of hazardous wastes. Today's charges demonstrate that those who refuse to comply with the law will be held to account and prosecuted."

This case is being prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorneys Dennis Mitchell and Erik M. Silber of the Environmental and Community Safety Crimes Section. The investigation into the three defendants' crimes is being conducted by the United States Environmental Protection Agency Criminal Investigations Division and the United States Department of Transportation's Office of Inspector General, with assistance from the California Department of Toxic Substances Control.

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California drought legacy: State approves \$2.5 billion to build new dams, water storage projects

In a historic vote, the administration of Gov. Jerry Brown on Tuesday approved spending \$2.5 billion to help fund construction of four new dams and four underground storage projects — including two in the Bay Area.

The funding came from Proposition 1, a water bond approved by voters in November 2014 during California's five-year drought. It is believed to be the largest commitment of state money to construct new dams and water storage projects in California since 1960, when voters approved a bond to build Oroville Dam and the State Water Project.

"This meeting represents a huge step forward," said Armando Quintero, chairman of the California Water Commission, a state agency that approved the funding Tuesday on an 8-0 vote.

The vote for four new dams and four underground storage projects followed several years of public meetings and [evaluations of a dozen projects](#).

Among the top-scoring projects that received the most money are two in the Bay Area: \$485 million to the Santa Clara Valley Water District to construct a new 319-foot-tall dam at Pacheco Pass in rural southern Santa Clara County, and \$459 million to the Contra Costa Water District to raise the height of the dam at Los Vaqueros Reservoir in eastern Contra Costa County by 55 feet, increasing the lake's size by about 70 percent.

The new funding would pay roughly half the cost of each project.

The local agencies still need to raise the rest of the money through other sources, including asking for federal funding, partnerships with other water districts, and raising local water rates. If they are unable to complete those steps by Jan. 1, 2022, they will lose the state funding, although backers of both Bay Area projects say they expect to meet that deadline.

The estimated total cost of the new Pacheco Reservoir is \$969 million. Construction would start in six years, after the Santa Clara Valley Water District purchases thousands of acres of ranch land surrounding the site just north of Highway 152 near Casa de Fruta, completes engineering and environmental studies, raises the rest of the money and secures water rights.

"It's important for the residents of Santa Clara County to have another source of water that's reliable," said Richard Santos, chairman of the Santa Clara Valley Water District's board. "I think it's the right thing for the future. I'm very proud of what we are doing. We're going to get more droughts. And temperatures are getting hotter. Having a new reservoir really is an insurance policy."

The district has 10 reservoirs and provides water to 2 million people in San Jose and other parts of Santa Clara County. If completed, the Pacheco project would hold 140,000 acre feet of water — enough for the annual needs of about 700,000 people. The new reservoir would be built on top of a small reservoir of only 6,000 acre feet that was built in the 1930s. It would become the largest in Santa Clara County, surpassing the 90,000-acre foot Anderson Lake near Morgan Hill, which was constructed in 1950.

The Los Vaqueros expansion would construct a much larger reservoir.

Its total project cost is estimated at \$980 million, and environmental studies are already completed. The Contra Costa Water District would raise the height of Los Vaqueros Dam to 273 feet high. That would expand the reservoir's capacity from 160,000 acre-feet to 275,000 acre-feet, providing more water for Bay Area cities during droughts and some for wildlife refuges near Los Banos. Already 15 water districts, including East Bay Municipal Utility District and San Francisco Public Utilities Commission, have expressed interest in helping fund the project and sharing its water, said Jennifer Allen, a spokeswoman for the Contra Costa Water District.

"It's a positive step forward for a project we have been looking at for quite some time," Allen said. "This is a good opportunity for us locally, and for other agencies around the Bay Area and Central Valley."

Environmental groups, who often file lawsuits to oppose new dams because they block rivers and kill salmon and other fish and wildlife, have supported the Los Vaqueros project. Among the supporters are the Nature Conservancy, Audubon California and the Planning and Conservation League.

Plans call for ground to be broken in 2022, Allen said, with the project finished in 2028.

Water for both Los Vaqueros and Pacheco would come from the Sacramento-San Joaquin River Delta. For Los Vaqueros, water already is sent through the Contra Costa Canal from the Delta into Los Vaqueros, which is currently 95 percent full, and which provided a cushion to Contra Costa County residents during the drought.

For Pacheco, the water would be piped from nearby San Luis Reservoir, where Santa Clara Valley Water District stores water it purchases under state and federal contracts from the Delta.

The water commission also approved funding for four groundwater storage projects. Those projects are \$280 million to the Sacramento Regional County Sanitation District to treat recycled wastewater and provide it to farmers in Sacramento County; \$207 million to the Inland Empire Utilities Agency to store recycled water in a groundwater storage bank in San Bernardino County for use by local cities, businesses and farms; \$67 million for the Kern Fan groundwater storage project near Bakersfield; and \$95 million for the Willow Springs groundwater bank in Kern County, which would add 500,000 acre-feet of new storage.

The funding from Proposition 1 is not without controversy, however.

Two of the projects the board approved, funding for Temperance Flat Dam in the Southern Sierra east of Fresno and Sites Reservoir in Colusa County, will face certain lawsuits from environmental groups.

Temperance Flat, a \$2.6 billion project, was awarded only \$172 million Tuesday under a scoring system in which state officials required supporters of each project to document in detail the public benefits in a cost-benefit ratio. The Sites project was awarded \$816 million. Its total cost is estimated at \$5.2 billion.

Jay Lund, director of the UC Center for Watershed studies, noted that Proposition 1 was the first time in California history that the state agreed to fund large water projects with general obligation bonds, which are repaid from the state's treasury. Other water projects have been funded with revenue bonds, in which money from each water district paid off the bonds through local taxes and water rates.

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"It is taking money from the state general fund that provides for schools, prisons and everything else and gives it to some of the most well-off water districts in the state," Lund said, noting the state must repay the bonds, with interest over decades. "Every billion of that is going to be taking \$50 million out of the general fund every year for a long time."

BACKGROUND:



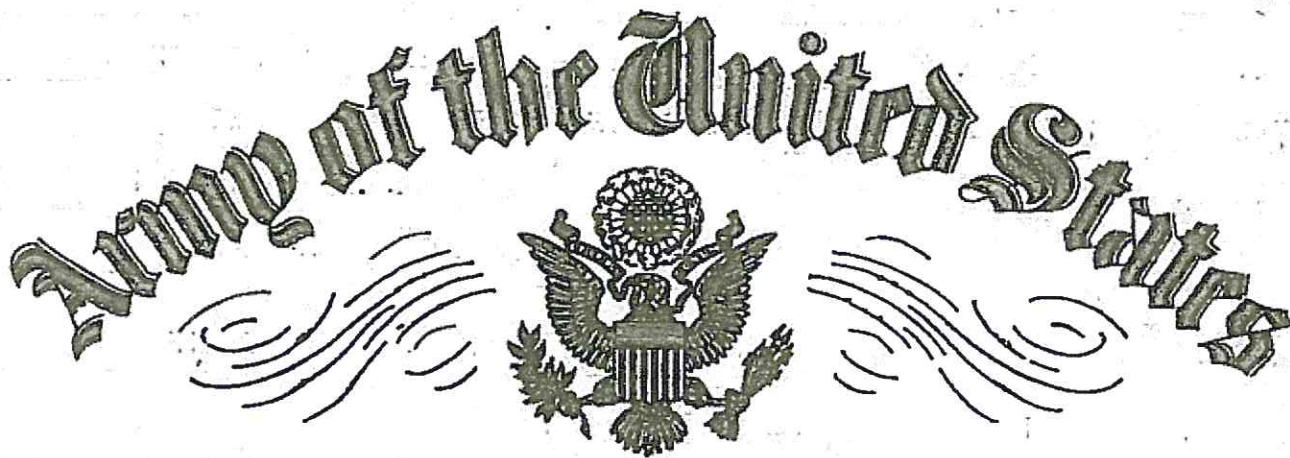

Jurupa District Hires Manager

Although a premature announcement concerning the hiring of William Huckell as first general manager of the Jurupa Community Services District was made last week in one of the daily papers, Huckell's official appointment was not made until Monday night by the district's board of directors.

Huckell, manager of the Rubidoux Community Services District since 1958, leaves his former district without a manager for the time being.

However, the Rubidoux district has been looking for a manager since Huckell told the directors he was leaving, and at least 14 have applied for Huckell's former position.

The Rubidoux directors went over the applications Monday night and picked out the ones they wanted to interview. It was expected that the directors would try to reach a decision as soon as possible.

AFTER World War II, Huckell operated the Rubidoux Dairy in the vicinity of Mayfair Market.

Since about 1951, Huckell served as commissioner for the old Rubidoux Fire District.

When the latter merged

with the Rubidoux Community Services District in 1958, the district's board of directors was enlarged. Huckell was elected to the district board and served until he became manager of the district.

He became manager when approached by other members of the board following Cecil Coffey's resignation.

Under Huckell's managerial reins, the district has improved considerably and the various faucets of the district are operating efficiently.

THE RUBIDOUX fire department has two new trucks and two new stations, as of about August 1959. The sewage treatment plant is operating efficiently, and the district's sewer lines are in good shape.

The district recently went into the water business, and its operation in this area is running smoothly.

In going to the younger

but larger area-wise, Jurupa Community Services District, Huckell is getting into a district which is just beginning to function, as far as providing services is concerned.

After a long, delayed battle, the Jurupa district has finally been able to get its sewerage project underway and looks forward to seeing it in operation by the end of 1961.

When this is done, the district will be providing its first service.

HUCKELL joins board president Lloyd Lovvorn and the other directors in the belief that the Jurupa district has tremendous potential in industrial as well as residential and commercial growth.

And, with the installation of a sewerage system and a sewage treatment plant, it is felt that the Jurupa district is on the brink of a new era.

The Jurupa district has set up offices in Paul Anderson's building at 8983 Mission Blvd.

The district phone (OV 5-4393), which has been located in President Lovvorn's home, is supposed to be transferred to the new office this week.

The district will also have a secretary in the office, and regular hours will probably be established to serve Jurupa district residents.

District Staff inspected and approved the water and sewer improvements and determined that the facilities were installed to District standards and, consequently recommend acceptance to the Board of Directors tonight.


